

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: (Microphone not activated) ...passed out. This bill dealt with the rights of cities to as annexation...as they annex different territories, is to set up some guidelines. And this amendment was offered...or is being offered by...as by...from the Department of Revenue to address some specific concerns within the bill. And it, in part, deals with where the territory is annexed that it crosses or partly a federal decimal census that it's not...you don't address the whole area of the census. And simply what it does, it simply says in the section (c) of the bill, Section 1, subsection (c), it says reasonable interpretation. And this amendment then simply puts some different language that what it says that gives some...gives the Department of Revenue and the Director some leeway in the way that they deal with their reasonable interpretation. And so, with that, unless there is any question, I would just ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the amendment by Senator Hartnett? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Hartnett? Waives closing. We will now vote on the Hartnett amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the Hartnett amendment. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Hartnett's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The Hartnett amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the advancement of LB 726 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 726. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. LB 268.

CLERK: LB 268, Senator, I do have E & R pending.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the adoption of the E & R amendments
