As she stated in her letter that each of the other two bills which are now amendments have merits in their own right, but she was concerned about what they would do to this particular bill. Her preference would be that the bill would have stood on its own, passed through as it was. But I certainly appreciate your putting this in the record. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Any other discussion on the second half of the amendment offered by Senator Avery? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Avery? He waives closing. We will now vote on the second half of the Avery amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the second portion of Senator Avery's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The second portion of the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill at this time.

SPEAKER BAACK: SENATOR HOHENSTEIN:

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the advancement of LB 830 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 830. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. LB 387.
