SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Exactly, yes.

There will be a lot of other state legislatures today and tomorrow looking at the same issues we're looking at, but it's one of those ones where you get the opportunity to say, no, thank you, Congress, we don't want your federal mandate. If you have any other questions I'd be glad to visit with you personally, but I think this is a great opportunity for the State of Nebraska. I'll make sure that we get this taken to the Governor and that it is properly given to Congress, if he sees fit in the administration to send this rejection as well. With that, thank you for the questions and the opportunity to tell Congress to go fish this morning. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. We will now vote on the motion to adopt LR 53. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
