CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please check in. Would the senators please check in. Please record your presence. Senator Landis, please check in. Senator Pirsch, please check in. We're looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Moore, Senator Hohenstein and Senator Withem. Senator Hohenstein, would you please check in. Still looking for Senator Withem. Senator Witek, Senator Withem is on his way up. Do you wish to proceed? Okay. We'll proceed with a roll call vote on the motion to bracket LB 627.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1265-66 of the Legislative Journal.) 16 ayes, 26 nays.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. I will raise the call. Are there amendments, Mr. Clerk?
