

Coordsen, and Schimek. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 20, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Madam President. (See AM0610 on page 908 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Madam President and members of the body, I am going to do something unusual here at this time and that is I am going to explain the committee amendment and then I'm going to ask that you vote against the committee amendment because Senator Baack has an amendment that he is going to introduce to replace it, which will incorporate actually the committee amendment. When the committee heard the bill, which has to do revisions in the Campaign Finance Act, we also heard a suggestion from Senator Baack that we delay the implementation of the bill until January of 1995 for a number of reasons, which I will let Senator Baack explain. But the committee did not understand, I guess, that Senator Baack wanted us to not only adopt a new date of operation but to adopt the suggested changes in the Campaign Finance Act. I think the committee was amenable to doing that but it was just a miscommunication. So what Senator Baack has done, he has drafted a new amendment incorporating those other provisions. With that, I would simply urge people to vote down the committee amendment so that we may consider Senator Baack's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Does anyone else wish to address the committee amendments? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Schimek? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 1 aye, 20 nays on adoption of committee amendments, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Committee amendments are not adopted. I will recognize Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will just take up that amendment, if you don't mind, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Baack would move to amend, Madam President. The amendment is on page 1629 of the Journal. (See AM0871.)
