SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen and Senator Moore. Senator Elmer. The question has been called, do I see five hands? I do. We will now vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, I'd ask for a call of the house and accept call-in votes.

SPEAKER BAACK: A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Call-in votes have been authorized. We are voting on ceasing debate.

CLERK: Senator Pirsch voting yes. Senator Witek voting yes. Senator Schellpeper voting yes. Senator Rasmussen voting yes. Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Dierks voting yes. Senator Robinson voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays to cease debate, Ma'am President, Mr. President, excuse me.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased and I will remind the body we are under call. Members, please report to the Chamber and record your presence. We are under call. Senator Moore, would you like to close on the advancement of LB 429.
