PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 319. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 319 is advanced. LB 377.

CLERK: I have E & R pending, first of all, Senator.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 377.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, the first amendment I have is by Senators Horgan and Rasmussen. I do have a note they want to withdraw, actually withdraw AM502, Senator? Right?

SENATOR HORGAN: Right.

CLERK: 784, you want to withdraw. AM921, you do want to take up?

SENATOR HORGAN: Right.

CLERK: Okay. (AM921 appears on page 1074 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Horgan.

SENATOR HORGAN: Thank you, Madam President and members. This amendment, offered to LB 377, dealing with the Americans With Disabilities Act, is an amendment that further defines modifications to buildings that are done in remodeling of buildings and what would be required of people when they do that under the Americans with Disabilities Act. The amendment is in your Journal page, on 1074, and simply clarifies and is really an amendment that we've brought on behalf of, Senator Rasmussen and I have brought on behalf of the building industry. Senator Wesely, I think, and his staff have reviewed the amendment and find it acceptable. And it really just clarifies what is a remodeled building and what is simply...some simple wall papering and painting and other adjustments that you make to a building.
