SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, AM1521, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. These amendments to LB 406 are a series of five very short and minor clarification amendments. The first of the amendments simply makes clear when a lien attaches in the event that there is to be a lien against property pursuant to the sections of this statute. The second one simply makes clear that not...that only one permit would be required, and not two, in those instances where a particular product may be defined as a pesticide, under FIFRA, and also be regulated under these particular statutes. The third provision simply clarifies that the Department of Agriculture can ask for any information that it may require, along with information specified in the statute. The fourth of the clarifying amendments further defines sufficient hazard. And the fifth and last simply makes clear that resolutions as well as ordinances are prohibited insofar as they're enacted by political subdivisions in contradiction to the state authority. I'd be glad to answer questions about any of these small matters. I think that Senator Dierks is okay on these, and I think they've been...and they have been agreed to by the department. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam President, members of the body, the...the amendments that Senator Beutler has brought to LB 406 are all fine with the Department of Agriculture and with the Ag Committee. So we are in accord on them, and I'd just urge your support and we could get on with the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Does anyone else wish to speak to the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Beutler? Closing is waived.
