One of the things we're going to have to do, if we enact this law, is to carry out an educational effort, especially with financial institutions because...or that's not necessarily our responsibility, but those that do that, because this does change significantly how you prepare and sign your signature cards in the banks with regard to CDs and accounts. And it would be important that bank personnel, savings and loan personnel understand the alternatives and help people so that they get the result that they want when they title a signature card. Thank you, Madam.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: I move that LB 250 be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've all heard the motion to advance LB 250. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 250 is advanced. LB 458.

CLERK: LB 458, Senator, I do have E & R pending.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. This is the Uniform Judgment Act, which allows you to bring a judgment obtained in another state into this state and to execute it. And we have a phrase in the model law which probably makes little sense in Nebraska. It says, the notice for the filing of this foreign judgment would include the name and the post office address of the judgment
