SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, I...I think the agreement was that we were going to run the other amendment that would put this stuff out into these gun dealers, they would put all these materials out there, everyone agreed to it, that it was something that we could...everyone could live with, it didn't infringe, and they were willing to do it. And I think when you come in now and say you're going to be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor, it adds a new wrinkle to a bill...to an amendment that was not agreed upon.

SENATOR WESELY: So, you're...first off, you're objecting to the fact that some agreement had been struck, but...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Right.

SENATOR WESELY: ...now it's being changed. Well, and the second concern you have is that people have already agreed voluntarily do this, so they...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR WESELY: ...don't really need this penalty?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Right, they have...the...everyone involved said that this is something they will do, they will give out this information. They will do everything that the amendment, that was agreed upon earlier, that they would do that. And I think that's the amendment that we should be running.

SENATOR WESELY: And...and this agreement is in terms of dealers of...of...gun dealers?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Well, I...I appreciate Senator Schellpeper's concerns. I was not party to any agreement, so I don't have any particular feeling that I have an obligation to support or not support Section 3. I guess, typically whenever you say something shall be done, there's usually some type of penalty involved. But if, again, there's an agreement that
