

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, definitely.

SENATOR ASHFORD: ...of blocking the passage of some other legislation.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They are committed to that.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Okay. With that...with that understanding, Madam President, I will file a motion right now to strike Section 3, with the understanding that the NRA is actually going to...to fund...help fund this project, number one; and, number two, that the...I would also mention that the Department of Health has already developed, at least partially, the information that will be distributed, and it would be my hope that the funds that could be collected into this fund would be used to mail...I believe that's what we talked about, is that right, Senator Schellpeper, to mail the information to the...to the gun dealers and with some instructions on what to do with it and so forth and so on. Okay. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Ashford, are you going to file a new motion? Okay. No amendment. Okay. We'll continue with debate. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Has Senator Ashford filed a new motion? I'll waive off until...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay, Senator Ashford, you brought us a new motion?

SENATOR ASHFORD: I appreciate Senator Schellpeper's representation. With that representation that the NRA is going to...at least has committed to him that they will...that they will financially contribute to this effort, to defray the cost of mailing and these...this material that has been developed by the Department of Health, I would move to strike Section 3 of the amendment.
