

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. But your intention is that it would be actively distributed...

SENATOR ASHFORD: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...and actively...

SENATOR ASHFORD: Well, that it would be...my intention is that we start this program, that the...at least the gun dealers that I've talked to are anxious to get involved in this. And actually I haven't talked to any that won't, but there may be some that won't do it. But we'll just have to monitor it and see how it goes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right, thank you. Senator Schellpeper, would you concur with that from your perspective?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, I agree wholeheartedly. I think that the NRA is committed to this type of education, and they are willing to put the information out, have all of their members and dealers become involved, because it's been very successful in other states, and they are committed to this program.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you. I just thought it was probably important to state that, because I've seen plenty of dusty pamphlets laying on counters in stores and different places that none of us bothers to even look at. And I would think if this was to be even partially successful, there ought to be an active movement on the part of the gun dealers, in this case, to participate and NRA, too. And I just would like to encourage that. I support the amendment.

PRE. IDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Fisher.

SENATOR FISHER: Madam President, members, I rise in support of this piece of legislation. I think there is certainly a strong awareness of gun accidents out there. I know a number of competitive shooters. But I think we all feel the same about this. I know a number of gun dealers. I think that they will be very supportive of this. And with the endorsement of the NRA, I think this is a piece of legislation that should be enacted, and ask for your support of this amendment with the...after striking Section 3. Thank you.
