

SENATOR LINDSAY: I believe the motion said no further debate nor amendment. I don't think he is entitled to close.

SPEAKER BAACK: That is correct, Senator Lindsay. Traditionally, we have allowed closing on amendments. We do do that. Traditionally, we have allowed closing on amendments, but he waives off. He does not want to close. We will now vote on this section of the Landis amendments on the safety committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of that portion of Senator Landis's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The second portion of the Landis amendment is adopted. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend. Senator, this is, I believe based on the division, the legislature is now going to discuss IMEs, is that right?

SENATOR LANDIS: That is correct.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Let me ask, by the way, if I, as the maker of this amendment, have the option for which order these come up or whether Senator Hall, as the maker of the division of the question, has the order? Senator Hall's choice is to take this third, and benefits fourth, and if his is the determining order, this is the next one. If it's my choice as the maker of the amendment, I guess I'd choose that the benefit section come next.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Point of order.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Landis, there was a discussion, I remember the discussion being held here right in front of me and we had that discussion and it seemed to me at that point there was an agreement that this would be the third portion that we would take up so I think we will take up this portion now.
