

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I've filed a...an additional motion for reconsideration that is on the desk now, on a...a vote that was previously taken, and I would ask the Chair for a ruling on whether, under Section...

SENATOR WITHEM: Point of order. Point of order.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Withem, only one point of order at a time, please. I will let....

SENATOR LINDSAY: I would simply ask for the Speaker's ruling on the request for reconsideration takes precedence...under Rule 7, Section 7, subparagraph (b), every motion to reconsider shall take preference over all other questions, except a motion to adjourn, which is the identical language to the cloture motion. And part of this is we are doing cloture, I think we've got to have some precedent on it. I'm just asking for a ruling on which motion would take precedence.

SENATOR WITHEM: Point of order (inaudible).

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lindsay, this same discussion came up on the tax issue, and at that point the Chair ruled that a motion to reconsider was out of order, and I will rule that that is the case in this case also. The motion to reconsider those is out of order. We will now proceed, under the rules, we will now proceed to vote on the motion to reconsider that's in front of us right now by Senator Chambers. We will now vote on the motion to reconsider. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted on the motion to reconsider? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 27 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider the amendment as offered by Senator Will.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion fails. Now we will now proceed to a motion...to the motion on cloture. And we will now vote on the cloture motion. All those in favor vote aye, oppos' vote no. Have you all voted?
