legislation. For that reason I would stand opposed to Senator Abboud's amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOUD: I'd like to withdraw the amendment at this time.

SENATOR CROSBY: No objections? It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Witek would move to amend. Senator, I've got 1486 in front of me. (Witek amendment may be found on pages 1750-54 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Witek, on your amendment.

SENATOR WITEK: Madam Chair, members of the body, my amendment, I'll explain it to you in just a minute if you all have it out in front of you. It's AM1486. This amendment would prohibit parole of those who commit a felony while on parole for another crime. A parolee who commits and is convicted of a felony while on parole would not be eligible for reparole on the original sentence or for parole during the sentence received for the new crime. This amendment would also require inmates to remain drug and alcohol free in order to be eligible for a parole. Any disciplinary action for drug or alcohol abuse within the prior year would prevent the parole of the inmate. This amendment would also require that the parolee submit to periodic testing for drug and alcohol abuse and that those parolees who abuse drugs or alcohol or refuse to submit to drug or alcohol test suffer a revocation of parole. It would also prohibit parole of habitual criminals until they have served at least their minimum sentence. Currently, habitual criminals are eligible for parole after serving only one-half of their minimum sentence. If anyone has any questions, I'd be glad to answer it.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Witek. Any discussion on Senator Witek's amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, the first thing I would like to do is divide the question and this would be the division. The first division would be, and these sections are not numbered consecutively all the way through, but the first one would be Section 1 found on page 1 which runs through page (sic) 21 on page 2.
