

buses, in fact, I don't even think one of the buses exists in the State of Nebraska at this point, and they're used primarily for consistency and to allow the Department of Motor Vehicles in the future to use these restrictions as people come forward with them. The second part of the bill allows for an examiner to waive a written part of the exam. Where this takes place is if you have someone who is a nonresident 'ho, let's say in the State of Iowa, has gotten a commercial drivers' license and now comes over to the State of Nebraska and wants to get a commercial drivers' license, if he has or she has another CDL in another state within the past two years and gives us suitable evidence that they have a similar test that they passed, a written test and a knowledge test which it's a fairly extensive test, if they've passed that and have had it within the last two years that the examiner may waive, doesn't say they must, may waive that particular part, they would still have to pass the driving part of that examination. And this would just primarily help deal with the volume of people and we found in practice that someone says, gee, last month I got a CDL in Kansas or Iowa, I come over here to operate and now I've got to go through the whole process again and timewise and expensewise, and since the tests are uniform across the country, this does not seem to be too big of a restriction to make. The final part of this clarifies that when someone has been revoked and they are being restated that they do have to complete the knowledge and skills test and that they also have to meet the physical certifications and they will have a check of their operator's license along with the payment of a reinstatement fee and that just clarifies that if you're going to...if you've lost this and you're going to get it back, you've got to go through the whole process again and pay your fee. That, primarily, is the impact of LB 420. I would be happy to answer any questions if you have any. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
