

of Nebraska at large. This does not apply, does not apply to farm licensed trucks. It only applies to farm related service industries. I believe the federal law is farm and ranch related service industries, farm supply co-ops, feed mills, I suppose, under certain conditions. But it's very limited as to what they could haul, limited amounts of fertilizer, very, very limited amounts of fuel, and small amounts of nonhazardous farm chemicals, basically delivery people. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. This is an amendment that makes some sense for agriculture, makes some sense for agricultural services, though it's not a great deal because of the tremendous numbers of restrictions placed on those persons that would be available to receive a restricted CDL license. But the seasonal aspect of many of our activities in the state would allow these types of licenses to be issued for the limited types of activities that they could be used for. And I would suggest for the convenience of agriculture, and the convenience of the seasonal type work, not involved with the hazardous materials or the pesticides, or large quantities or large trucks of any kind, that this is a proper thing to do and would support the amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
