PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...but if that's the information I gave, and she says it's false, blame him for lying, not me. But I'm going to push this issue. I'm going to do what I feel I need to do for my community and I'm not going to knuckle under for the Police Union or anybody else. And I'll tell you this much. See, the cops are not the only ones with guns. Why do they think nobody has been shooting at the police? You all don't recognize a restraining influence. In South Africa, they finally had to recognize when they were facing total chaos that Nelson Mandela, the one fought by the government, was the only one who could keep the chaos from occurring. There are analogous situations. You all need to think about the seriousness of what is before us, and I say again it goes beyond a worker-employer issue, it is public safety.
