It...this bill now imposes a new responsibility of contacting the Register of Deeds Office which isn't there before, and we've heard very little about that issue, but it is an onerous burden on the Register of Deeds Office. Secondly, it will require the excavator to make additional calls after the Register of Deeds tells them who has items buried. I think Senator Elmer did an excellent job of spelling out in his questions...they weren't really questions, it was just a nice explanation of how this process operates. It really isn't that onerous for a member of a one-call center to go out and help locate facilities. It's a lot better than having their facilities cut into and then having to worry about service problems. With that, I would urge your support of this amendment which will make the participation in the one-call center mandatory.
