

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: All right.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...with this definition, they're not included in the requirements to do that?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: If you are going to be digging in an area and you don't know where the line or the underground facility is and you have any doubt in your mind, the stat...the section would require you to call so you could determine where you were in relationship to the underground facility.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right, but you don't...my problem is here that you start to define those things where the...where you should call at. Right?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: There are some of them that are a bright line and then the unbright line is when necessary to determine proximity.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: If it's in a private property, I guess this qualifies that. I'm sorry to take the body's time. I just...when I read that I'm not so sure that makes it any clearer, Senator Wickersham. The rest of this I don't have a problem with. What I will probably do is I don't think that your language makes it any clearer, I think it just adds more words to it, but, at this point in time, why don't we do this. I don't have a problem with what the rest of it does. I'll take a look at it between now and Select and...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yeah.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...I think that this is probably an amendment that's been drawn up rather hastily...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...and it probably does need some massaging, but I will give you that I think the area may be a little vague. I don't share your concerns as much but I would accept this amendment at this point and we'll work on it.
