SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Mr. Clerk, you do have a motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a series of motions. The first is by Senator Moore as Chairman of Appropriations to move for the introduction of Reg. 1294.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, Reg. 1294 is a bill, it's actually the last one...1294, it's the second to the last one on the sheet that I distributed this morning. It's a bill dealing with the state presently now reimburses the travel costs of option enrollment students, both...twice a day is what it amounts to. The Appropriations Committee is recommending that we decrease that, instead of paying for four trips, or two round trips, it is our proposal we should only pay for one round trip, or two trips on a given day. The cost savings of this bill, if adopted, would be \$211,000. This motion is to simply introduce the bill. All eight of these motions are to simply introduce the bill. There's been an occasion in past years where the situation we've introduced bills and requested that they go directly to General File. All eight of these bills we are asking that there is 30 votes to introduce them this morning. They will go to the committee that the Exec Board refers them to and there will be a hearing when those committees set them, hopefully next week or whenever, but this is simply a motion to introduce the bill. It will go through the full hearing process and the full process. And with that simple explanation I'd ask for 30 votes so we can introduce this bill and get it introduced.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Discussion on the motion to introduce the bill. Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. These motions do require 30 votes and we do have to do each one separately, each bill introduction. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the introduction of Reg. 1294.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is introduced. Next motion, Mr. Clerk.
