CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Moore would move for the introduction of Req. 1291.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, Mr. Speaker, 1291 is a bill that eliminates state reimbursement to school districts for the tuition cost of children whose parents live on federal lands as well as tuition reimbursement by the Department of Aeronautics for children of parents on state-owned airfields and, lastly, the bill eliminates reimbursement by cities to parents residing on tax-exempt airfields. The bill is worth a total of about \$17,000. I'd ask for 30 votes to introduce the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the motion by Senator Moore. Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the motion? It does require 30 votes. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the introduction of Req. 1291.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is introduced. Next motion.

CLERK: Senator Moore would move for the introduction of Req. 1295, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: 1295 is a bill that deals with certificate of need fees. Presently that whole operation receives \$223,000 in General Funds. This bill would make that basically a cash-funded operation and have those that are requesting certificate of need pay the fee themselves, thereby decreasing the General Fund obligation by almost a quarter of a million dollars. And so with that I'd ask for the 30 votes to introduce the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the motion by Senator Moore. Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
