CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the introduction of Req. 1295.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is introduced. Next motion.

CLERK: Senator Moore requests the introduction of 1284, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: 1284 is a bill that would mandate vehicle title and registration that all counties get on the state system. The reason for this was twofold. One is that there is a federal mandate, the whole operation is going to have to work that way. Secondly, from an appropriation perspective, the only way we can achieve the cost savings in the Department of Motor Vehicles is when all counties are no longer...we no longer have to manually enter all the data coming from the counties and it would then be done by the entire statewide computer system, and until all 93 counties are on, we can't do that. By mandating this as of January 1, '95, by mandating this we will show a cost savings of \$147,000 in the second year of the biennium. So with that I'd ask for the adoption of the bill, for the 30 votes so I can introduce the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the motion by Senator Moore. Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the introduction of Req. 1284.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is introduced. Next motion.

CLERK: Senator Moore would move for introduction of Req. 1220.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: 1220 is a bill that would simply change from a "shall" to a "may" and take away the requirement that the Board of Appraisers has to annually publish a directory. It's only...we're only talking about \$2,100 but the only way we can save that money is to change that word from a "shall" to a "may". That is simply what the bill does. I'd ask for the 30 votes so the bill can be introduced.
