SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the motion by Senator Moore. Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the introduction of Req. 1220.

SPEAKER BAACK: The bill is introduced. Next motion.

CLERK: Senator Moore would move for introduction of Req. 1267.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Req. 1267 simply changes the way that the Board of Professional Engineers and Architects issue official seals. It would discontinue the requirement that a seal for a certificate has to be on all their documents. Realizes about \$7,000 savings in General Funds. Once again, it simply...the only way we can do this is through a statute change and with that I'd ask for the 30 votes for the introduction of the bill.
