

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 152A was introduced by Senator Dierks and Vrtiska. (Read title.) I do have an amendment from Senator Dierks. (See AM1280 found on page 1395 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HALL: Senator Dierks, on the A bill. I am sorry, Senator Dierks, on the amendment. Go ahead.

SENATOR DIERKS: This is the amendment we talked about earlier, wasn't it? On the bill, the amendment to the A bill, that was the amendment we talked about on the bill was the A bill. The reason for the amendment to the A bill is simply that...are you talking about the amendment to the A bill?

SENATOR HALL: Yes, that is what's before us, Senator Dierks, yes.

SENATOR DIERKS: The reason for the amendment to the A bill is simply that we are more clear now of the number of people, number of residents that will be beginning their training in '93 and '94, and the day on which they begin. The residents begin training in July, so incoming classes correspond to the state fiscal year. The original A bill assumed that partial year funding for '90-93, and we did not have a precise figure for '94, and the amendment corrects these problems.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Any discussion on the amendment to LB 152A? Seeing none, Senator Dierks waives closing. The motion is the adoption of the amendment to LB 152A. All those in favor signify by voting aye, those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Dierks amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The amendment is adopted. Senator Dierks...anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Dierks, on the bill.

SENATOR DIERKS: I think we've explained it, Mr. Speaker, so I'd just move for advancement.
