SENATOR HALL:     Dierks moves for advancement. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, the motion is the advancement of LB 152A to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:     25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 152A.

SENATOR HALL:     The bill is advanced. Other items.

CLERK:     Mr. President, first of all, I have a Reference Report from the Reference Committee referring the new appropriations bills introduced. Pursuant to that action, I have a motion from Speaker Baack to allow the suspension of the rules so as to permit public hearings to be held on these bills next Thursday, on May 3.

SENATOR HALL:     Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK:     Yes, Mr. Chairman and colleagues, I am making this motion to suspend Rule 3, Section 13, which will allow the various committees to hold the hearings next Thursday afternoon. The plan will be is that we will be in session in the morning, and then at noon we will adjourn. Then the committees that meet on either one or two days of the week, they will have their hearings from twelve until two, and the committees that meet three days a week will have their hearings from two until the conclusion of those, and that way we can get those hearings in. But we need to suspend this rule because we don't have the seven days advance notice of those hearings. And so with that, I would ask for your support in suspending the rules. It does take 30 votes and I would appreciate your support. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL:     Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Is there any discussion on the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, the question is, shall the rules be suspended? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:     30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the suspension of the rule.

SENATOR HALL:     The rule is suspended for purposes of public hearing.
