

it. We don't want the state to be obligated for any of this at all and I think it also says very clearly that we want it used for the applied technology. That's what we want them...if they're going to make these changes and they're going to move these programs, that's the kind of programs we are authorizing them to do with these dollars so I rise in support of the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Baack. Further discussion, Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: I simply rise to support the amendment, particularly the third portion of the amendment that eliminates the language which would allow for the state appropriations to support repayment of the bonds to be issued. If the Western Community College chooses to enter into this arrangement, I see no reason to have the language that the state at some point in time may come in and repay those bonds and so I'd just as soon in the beginning remove that language and with that I'd support the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Hillman. Any further discussion on Senator Hillman's amendment to the Baack amendment? Seeing none, Senator Hillman, would you like to close? Senator Hillman waives closing. We will proceed with the vote on Senator Hillman's amendment to Senator Baack's amendment. Those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted. Now on the original amendment. Senator Hillman, did you wish to speak on Senator Baack's amendment?

SENATOR HILLMAN: Madam Speaker, just a few things that I would just like to probably reinforce a little bit of what Senator Baack had said, the city campus being located in his district and of course Western Community College being located in the 48th District is that we are very, very dependent upon the community college. In looking at access to education, the types of education we need and to perhaps just to help the body a little bit to understand there has been a lot of study, discussion and with NCHEMS, Clarus Corporation and others doing
