

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Witek. Does anyone else wish to speak to the amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Chambers? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Chambers amendment to the Witek amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence? Would the senators please check in, the house is under call. Would the senators please check in. Senator Robinson and Senator Withem, please check in. We are looking for Senators Ashford, Landis, Wesely. We are still looking for Senator Ashford. Senator Chambers, did you wish a roll call vote? Okay. Would the senators please be seated. Would the senators please be seated. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1917 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 15 nays, Madam President.
