

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I appreciate your comments, Senator Day, and I guess, Senator Lindsay, the money is going for research, though. It is not...the money is not going to run...is it going to run the cancer center? It is my understanding it is going for research, isn't it?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That is correct. It is going for research and the Warner amendment, or, excuse me, the committee amendments that Senator Warner explained make that absolutely clear, yeah.

SENATOR ROBINSON: John, you know, you hit me right before, then the time went out, and I am glad the gentle man from the 7th is up at the speaker. I just want to give you the report on the Goodrich Store in Blair. It has had a change of two owners. Things have gotten so bad they had to raise the price of coffee from 25 to 35 cents too.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Robinson, for that update. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I just, at this point, just like to update you on the coffee. I stopped at the KWIK-Shop up in Omaha on the way down here and paid 50 cents for a cup of coffee, Senator Robinson. So I am going to start going up through your district and stop in at the Goodrich Store. I would like to touch on a couple of things, one is Senator Robinson made the point and I would reiterate that this does go for cancer research. It does not go for operation of any institution. It goes for cancer research. The second thing, to pick up on Senator Schimek's question, this is not...we are not opening new ground by doing this. We are, first of all, there is no closed class. This is very clearly an open class, so it is not a...I just don't think there is any constitutional problems with it, but the second thing is we do have, we contract with private organizations at the state level all the time. I mean, it is just...it is my understanding, for example, that some of the...the bulk of psychiatric training at the Med Center is done by contract through Creighton. Creighton does have a joint program with the University of Nebraska
