

that direction is to offer this amendment to reduce the court costs from \$4 to \$2. Is Senator Moore anywhere near? What I was going to ask Senator Moore was if he would go along with this process. But since he's not here...oh, here he is. Senator Moore, I would like to ask you a question.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Moore, what I'm proposing at this point is to lower the court cost from \$4 to \$2 and if this amendment is adopted, I would withdraw my amendment which would say that the increase in fee will not apply to situations involving a waiver. Are you willing to support this amendment with that assurance?

SENATOR MOORE: What about the other amendment on the judge's retirement?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I would try to get that but if I don't, that's a separate issue, which would have to stand or fall by itself.

SENATOR MOORE: Will it stand or fall...will it take eight hours to stand or fall by itself or will it stand (inaudible)?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It depends on how much other want to...how much time others want to spend debating it. But I would not offer that amendment for the purpose of preventing a vote on the bill, if that's what you're asking me. Ask the question...ask me what it is you want to ask me because the way you're asking...

SENATOR MOORE: Well, no, I'm...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you asking me...

SENATOR MOORE: ...with so much history, my mind's a little slow today, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, Senator Moore. Senator Moore, who got eight out of nine, he wants to rub it in. We've got nine games on the schedule, he whipped me outright in eight of them, whipped me in the ninth one but I was leading after the first quarter. I made a mistake in telling you that. I wasn't leading after the first quarter even. The game...I was tied.
