LB 841, 842

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. Senator Moore waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 841. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 841.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 841 advances. We'll now go to LB 842.

CLERK: LB 842, a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on April 30, referred to the Banking Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, LB 842 is the last bill of the package, at least until Monday, and 842 went before the Banking Committee and Senator Wehrbein handled that bill and so I give the balance of my opening to Senator Wehrbein.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members, this is a very, very simple bill. This simply eliminates the requirement that the Real Estate Appraisers Board, which annually publishes a director of appraisers directory, will not be required to do that and so it makes the change from a "shall" to a "may". This bill will allow the board to discontinue publishing the directory annually, thus reducing their expenditures. The amount of expenditures is in Cash Funds, by the way, but it is \$2,121. It is not a huge amount of money but it is a reasonable thing to do. The directory, because, I'll show you what a copy looks like. It comes out annually and it generally is almost like many of these kinds of things, somewhat out-of-date by the time it is published. This would enable them to do what they are doing now for an up-to-date and that is have...publish a computerized request...upon request edition of up-to-date membership and so this simply changes the word from "shall" to "may" and will allow them to continue doing what they are which is an up-to-date directory simply published by a computer but it will not actually have the directory per se. But the up-to-date membership would always be able to be gotten simply by a request of someone that was interested. So I would urge you to adopt
