

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: So you don't intend to introduce an emergency clause?

SENATOR LANDIS: No.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The legislation would therefore affect budgets...

SENATOR LANDIS: Oh, wait a second, I did...we did it in committee. There is an E clause.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: But you've struck all the original sections.

SENATOR LANDIS: That is true, in which case the E clause would be gone, wouldn't it?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Wait a minute, here it is, I'm sorry. It's back here on Section 5.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: It does not appear in the original bill. It does appear in the committee amendments and it reappears here.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay, so effectively this legislation, regardless in what form it passes, would affect two fiscal years for political subdivisions. Is that about...? Yeah, okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: I've got to tell you this, the prosecutorial style in which, when you know the answer, you want to extract it from me, seems really a lawyer's way of politically addressing the issue. If the answer is yes, Bob, yes, the answer is yes. On the other hand, I'd just as soon hear your argument as to what you think about this rather than the interrogation of what you already know.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay. What I'm really concerned about is the provisions, not because I don't think it's desirable that we address ADA requirements, but that was rejected in the committee, and I'm also concerned that we would, by these amendments, reject something that we had agreed upon which I think resulted in a satisfactory solution, particularly for
