SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Discussion on the amendment by Senator Kristensen? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Kristensen? He waive closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, the first two amendments dealt directly with LB 413 and their impact and I believe that 413 now is in a good position to allow us to take advantage of the system of a base state method of registration proof of financial responsibility and et cetera. Earlier in the session, LB 101 was introduced and this dealt with the maximum width of vehicles and some of the exceptions of vehicles on the road. We put LB 101 into the rules of the road earlier in this session. The State Patrol had that drafted. That draft came through the Transportation Committee. The legal counsel of the Transportation Committee wants to accept responsibility for this. I'm not sure I'm going to let him have all of it. I'm going to take part of that responsibility, but, certainly, there has now been a concern raised about how the bill and the width that we did with that amendment, what impact that may have on some existing machinery. To take that completely out of question, I'm just going to remove that entire addition that we did earlier and not try to change it and not try to fix it, just take it completely out of there, let them work on it throughout the summer, and it's one of those ones that if we leave it in there, the State Patrol has now some concerns that that may impact the ability of certain equipment dealers to legally move equipment down the highway that they can do today. I don't know that that's accurate but they have raised that concern. Instead of trying to patch it up, the best answer I know to do is just take it completely out of there and let them start with next year. We'll pledge that
