SPEAKER BAACK: And Senator Haberman has requested a machine vote. Is there any discussion on the advancement? If not, we will now have a machine vote on the advancement of LB 697. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 697.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 697 advances. We will now proceed back to...Senator Warner has now arrived, so we will go back to LB 98.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 98 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Withem. (Read title.) The bill was referred to Revenue, advanced to General File, committee amendments were adopted on May 13th. Senator Chambers made a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill. That is the first motion we have before the Legislature this afternoon, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a motion to indefinitely postpone. Senator Withem, do you wish to take it up?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers, on your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, as I look at the Duke of Withem, I'm not going to give him that satisfaction. I withdraw the motion.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers, you have the first amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this amendment I do intend to take up. Is this printed, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Well, you have two of them, Senator. The first is on 2094.
