

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: ...is that your experience?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, Senator Hohenstein. By putting it down to 10 percent you exclude most anything that has got any type of fruit juice in it whatsoever. It does...it...this amendment does help it somewhat. There are still...there may be still some grey areas, but just with a little insight on what it is to your clerks, they will be able to, much easier, handle this situation. I'm still opposed to the bill, but this amendment does help considerably. It puts it down on products such as Kool-Aid and things like this that are more flavored drinks other than nutritious.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Okay, thank you both.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Hohenstein. There are no other lights, Senator Chambers, to close on the amendment. He waives closing on the amendment. The question is, shall the amendment to LB 98 be adopted? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The amendment is adopted. Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Discussion on the advancement of the bill? Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Withem, would you ans...Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Withem, would you ask (sic) a question, please.

SENATOR WITHEM: I'd be happy to ask you a question. What question would you like me to ask?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Senator Haberman,...no, I think I misinterpreted your intent.
