

If anyone contributes more than, under this bill, more than \$250 cumulatively, you have to go ahead and report it. So it's actually an increase of \$50.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Okay.

SPEAKER BAACK: Because it was \$200 that you'd have to report, \$100 each election, now it's going to go to 250.

SENATOR ASHFORD: And that's during an election period, which would be the year of the election?

SPEAKER BAACK: During an election year, yes, that's correct.

SENATOR ASHFORD: All right, all right. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. That's all I have, thanks.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Ashford. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, Senator Baack, if I could ask you a question, please.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BROMM: I...I'm trying to find in here the change that you're alluding to, the \$250 covers the entire election year rather than, as I see it, it says, during the period covered by the report. Now, do you only have to report once during the entire election? Don't you have to report more often than that?

SPEAKER BAACK: We are going to go to a cumulative report for the election year, that's what the accountability is asking us to go to, is a cumulative report for the election year.

SENATOR BROMM: What section of the bill does that? I am having trouble with that.

SPEAKER BAACK: I'm trying to find it here, Senator Bromm. It's the bottom of page 11 and the top of page 12. Yeah, it says that your contributions more than \$250, then it talks about having to report their addresses and those kind of things, then it says, contributed by that individual for the election period. And the election period is the election cycle. Yes, and on
