I think if we have an opportunity to discuss it that I can convince you that this is very, very reasonable proposition for the cities and especially for the 350 small towns in this state who are not getting anything from keno. So I hope you'll allow us the opportunity to discuss it. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. That was the closing on the motion to overrule the Chair. Just for purposes of the body's understanding, a vote yes is to overrule the Chair, a vote no is to sustain the ruling of the Chair that the amendment is not germane. We have four members who are absent so it will take 23 votes to overrule the Chair. The question is, shall the Chair be overruled? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR HALL: The Chair is not overruled.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Baack.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Baack, on the amendment.

CLERK: AM2149, Senator. (Baack amendment appears on page 2193 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. Chairman and colleagues, I believe...this is the one I believe I turned in today, is it not?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BAACK: Okay.

CLERK: It's a simple one-word change.

SENATOR BAACK: It has the one-word change. There is a place in the bill where it talks about individuals and their contributions. In one place in the bill the...when we were drafting the amendment they used the word "person" instead of "individual" and it changes it back to...yes, it's on page 12, line 12, and it changes the...it talks about in the first part
