

under call. Senator Fisher, would you check in, please. We're looking for Senators Beutler, Lindsay, Robak. Senator Elmer, would you check in, please. We're looking for Senator Robak. We are now ready to vote on the Wesely amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. A roll call vote has been requested. Members, please keep your conversations down so the Clerk may hear your responses. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2208 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails. I will raise the call.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill at this time, Mr. President, on the committee amendments, excuse me.

SPEAKER BAACK: We're now on the committee amendments. Discussion on the committee amendments. Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I'd like to ask Senator Moore some questions, if I might.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore, would you respond, please.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Earlier, Senator Coordsen asked you if we don't do anything, the budget for the next biennium will increase by how much, even if we don't increase any extra...extra taxes.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, that's not the question that Senator Coordsen asked me. But I'll answer Senator Coordsen's question now that I have the mike.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay, that one first, then I will move along.

SENATOR MOORE: If you refer...if you refer to page 2 of the budget book, of the ongoing revenues, his question was, how much do revenues go up? And the answer to that question is obviously we have some difficulty, because of 829. I think page 2, the ongoing revenues, shows what occurs there. I mean the ongoing estimated revenues go from 1.519 to 1.611, in the first year,
