

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay, so it is accounted for in the ongoing out years?

SENATOR MOORE: I mean, it's...if you look on the green...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Really...

SENATOR MOORE: ...if you look on the green sheet,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Oh.

SENATOR MOORE: ...if you look on the green sheet, the third line from the top will show you that \$5 million running across there.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The reason I asked that is because as 330 currently exists, at least in my understanding of it, it requires an after tax contribution of...or reduction in the income of every man, woman and child in Nebraska of some \$10. And I was wondering if, in fact, the 15 to 17 million dollars was accurate, or if we needed more money to factor in for the last, last of the biennium's deficit appropriation. That will carry forward into the following year.

SENATOR MOORE: I mean,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: And LB 495 will carry for...will appropriate that money in '95-96.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Is that correct?

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay, so that just goes on. Thank you, Senator Moore. I recall, quite vividly, seven years ago, bill came up, increase the fishing licenses from \$7, I believe, to \$11. And, at that time, I was newly elected and I thought that, by golly, based upon the amount of money in my personal budget, that \$7 was a gosh awful plenty for a fishing license. So I voted my conscience in what I felt to be the best interest of my district and I looked up at the board at that General File vote and there was red...one red eye looking back at me, one red eye.
