

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When we get to 757, the workers' comp bill and there's extended discussion, will you support a bracket motion on that until June 9th, so that we can study that and get additional information?

SENATOR BROMM: Depend...depending on the circumstances and whether the body is paralyzed, as I think they are on this bill, there would be circumstances where I could support that, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now...oh, that's all I have to ask you. Thank you very much. Senator Witek had said what do you tell the county attorneys if this bill doesn't take the form they want. What happened to them this year has been happening to them down through the years. See, they've been here...around a lot, and they know it, so there's nothing they need to be told. And they could have told you what was going to happen to this bill. And by the way, she mentioned she is carrying water for the Attorney General. She was frank in admitting that, I finally got that message through to her and she re...re...regurgitates it correctly. But her hero just lost another case in the U.S. Supreme Court, wasted money on another case. And the county attorneys are the ones who had advised the State Patrol to make what courts have said are illegal drug stops. The thing about this case that reflects so bad on the...badly on the Attorney General is that the trial court judge repressed, suppressed the evidence taken in this illegal stop. So the prosecutor appealed it, and the Court of Appeals said the judge is right, you have to weigh the interests of the motoring public and their right to privacy against what the State Patrol has been told to do, and the rights of the citizens win, and this evidence should have been suppressed. So the prosecutors took it on to the Nebraska Supreme Court. And those judges sat around after they had a good laugh and said, this fella doesn't learn. The trial judge tried to tell him, the Court of Appeals tried to tell him, we're not even going to consider this. Didn't even consider it. So then Mr. Stenberg, Senator Witek's hero, ran to the Supreme Court, which had just slapped him down a couple of times earlier this year, and he got slapped down again without comment. But those judges sat around and they said, now every court in his state told him this is an unconstitutional invasion of the citizens rights, so why does he bring it to us, and just threw it on back down here to Nebraska. So what he's probably doing is someplace whining now about how unfair the U.S. Supreme Court is cause they won't hear his case, how unfair the Nebraska Supreme Court is cause they wouldn't
