LB 220, 231

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I would like to withdraw that motion

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is withdrawn.

CLERK: (Read LB 220 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 220 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 2582-83 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 220 passes with the emergency clause attached. LB 231.

CLERK: Senator Hohenstein would move to return the bill for specific amendment. (See AM1927 on page 2048 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hohenstein.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. Let me to try to give a brief history of LB 231, and the handout I previously sent around explains exactly what I attempting to do here and the amendment that would essentially strike an amendment that was previously offered on General File by Senator Ashford. That's what the motion to return to Select File would strike that language, and I would have offered that on Select File originally, but the Select File came up and I believe Senator Ashford had to be gone that day, so I agreed not to offer it until he was here, in case he had any specific objections. On General File on 231 Senator Ashford offered an amendment which would, the language of that amendment is in the handout, which would prohibit Class III forms of gaming as defined in section, in 25 U.S.C 2703 of the federal Indian Gaming Regulatory Act conducted on tribal lands except those specific types and methods of gaming currently prevented by Nebraska statutes. And the intent I believe of that was to make clear that no Class III forms of gaming which were not currently offered, currently permitted by Nebraska statutes would be
