

between the tribes and the State of Nebraska, would be conducted in accord with the standards of honesty and integrity of other gambling being conducted in Nebraska.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Senator, I don't think that's high enough a standard.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then why do we want to place a higher standard on the Native Americans? And I agree with you. It's practically no standard at all.

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: It's no...I mean, you want to, you want to use a standard of any gambling across the State of Nebraska, I'm not sure I want to accept that. I think, what I would accept and I think is appropriate is if you...if the language itself is offensive and you amended it to say, shall be conducted in accordance with the standards adopted or in the federal Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, that's all you need to say. That's really all you need to say and leave the other stuff out. To me that says the same thing without having the language in there. And if that's the concern, that amendment, I think, would take care of all the concerns that we have.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Alright then, let us strike this language and then we'll put that that you mentioned.
