

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: And then hopefully if we agree with that then we could move on to the other items on the agenda?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schellpeper. Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes. Madam President and members, we're working on the amendment right now back here, Ernie and Senator Hohenstein. Senator Chambers and Senator Hohenstein are working on the amendment that will be acceptable and it will basically say that it will follow the Indian Gaming Act rules. And that's all that needs to be in there. We can take out the Nebraska language that Senator Chambers is, is not happy with. And I think that will, I think, get him off of his opposition to the bill. And I think that's the only thing in the bill that he opposes at the present time. So there's an amendment on its way up there. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Does any one else wish to speak to this amendment, or this motion? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, the thing we'll do is return this and strike it, then readvance the bill, and by then we'll have the substitute language drafted.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We'll now vote on the motion to return to Select File. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, on the motion to return the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted and we are at Select File. Senator Chambers for opening on an amendment.
