

them is run out of Philadelphia. They run seven or eight clinics. The head of it brings home a half a million dollars a year. His wife brings home a quarter of a million for running clinics. The docs are on salary. The docs don't have that ownership interest and that's why even something that doesn't...that looks so basic, like the name of a doctor, is so important because you don't know. We have docs flying in from Indiana to perform abortions in Nebraska and we don't even want them to know who the name is. We...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR LINDSAY: ..fear information. This amendment, I think, goes to prevent that information from arriving.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Madam President and members of the body, I, too, want to thank those of you who chose to stay and wonder if there was a fire drill that the rest of us missed here. I want to rise in support of this amendment again, saying this is something that came out of not only a few of us on my particular side of the issue that wanted this, but really came as a result of negotiation discussions that we had very early on. I would hope that you would all go back and take a few minutes to look at where we've been on this process. Look at the original LB 110. The original LB 110 is maybe three and a half lines of new language to the existing informed consent law in the State of Nebraska. It adds two substantive changes to LB 110 (sic)...to the existing law regarding informed consent. One is that it says that the information needs to be provided 24 hours preceding an abortion and, two, that now we shall include among the list of four other things that are in existing statute information about gestational development. There are no penalties in here for physicians. There is no requirement for the physician's name. There is no new definition of abortion. There is no new definition of emergency situation. None of that that Senator Lindsay just referred to as fallacies in this existing amendment that Senator Bohlke is offering was in the original LB 110 and, furthermore, it was not in the committee amendment as it came out of committee. None of those things were in there. The three things that were added in the committee amendment were the direction to the Health Department to develop the materials and a new definition of emergency, but not a new definition of abortion and, finally, that there was
