It seems to me like what they did was put out a fiscal note that we went ahead and approved the other day and now they're putting out the amendment to fill the fiscal note. I don't think it's necessary.

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR WITEK: I hate to see us have to go through three hours of debate over this, but I think we all know that's where we're headed. I think we should vote against this amendment. Certainly, if you would like a toll-free number, we can put it back into the 110 that we had...that we are dealing with and go from there. We do not need the rest of this amendment. I would urge you to vote against this amendment. We can, at any time, put in an 800 number, as Senator Bohlke talked about. The rest of this amendment, I think these have already been discussed enough, decided upon in the 110 that we are dealing with now, so I will urge you to vote against this amendment. Take a good look at it before you vote, please. Thank you.
