SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Chambers, you're next.

Senator Lindsay has really been working hard, along with Senator Rasmussen, Senator Bohlke, Senator Day and Senator Landis, to try to reach an accord. Oh, I don't see John's mother here, but if she were here I was going to tell her that no only is he a good son, he's almost reached the status where I can call him Saint John, but I'm not going to do that. (Laugh.) Okay. If we can reach some kind of agreement it would probably be the first time since any of these bills have ever come before us that that has taken place.
