

and focus on what we've agreed on is the common goal. Senator Lindsay, I wanted to ask you a question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: One of the things we've talked about that we still really haven't clarified to my level of comfort is that the person who gives the information specifically regarding the medical risk of both pregnancy and live birth and those kinds of things that are in the legislation, we now say it's a physician, physician assistants or an RN with...taking existing statute language to list the qualifications. I really think the best thing to move towards would be not worry about the label or the license category of health care professional but to focus on the training that that person has. Would you agree to continue to work on that either both this session, if we could get it done, if not, next time around?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yes.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Because I...what you run into and one of my concerns about saying physician assistants is whether or not they are available to provide this. And if there is that unwritten agenda that says, okay, what I want to do is pick a professional that's not available and therefore the clinics can't do this and the physician has to do it all, then we've sort of broken the faith here of trying to come up with good resolution on this. So I'm...I'm going to accept this in its present status but hope that we can continue to work on it. The other issue is the Bohlke amendment had in it a requirement that we promote the dissemination of the printed materials. Do you...do you have any trouble doing that? We've removed it from the language of the bill.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm sorry, Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Do you have any trouble with the Bohlke proposal? And her amendment was to actually promote the dissemination of the printed materials?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Absolutely none. I have no problem with it.
