

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR WESELY: ...informed consent and information shared on this, again, is a wise and reasonable thing to do as long as harassment isn't part of it, as long as you're not trying to set somebody up to be attac'ted and I don't think with the change from the criminal penalties to civil, if that's the case. So I think the compromise at this point looks good. I only raise the one cautionary note and, again, urge consistency when other issues come forward dealing with information exchange on this that we be open to the idea of information fully being disclosed to individuals.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Mr. Speaker, members, just very quickly. I would just like to probably mention again the health care centers throughout the state and look at the types of things that Senator Lindsay's amendment would require in looking at the information and that that person would have training on the following subjects of sexual and reproductive health, abortion technology, contraceptive technology, short-term counseling skills, community resources referral and informed consent. And I spoke earlier about all the services that are currently being provided at the health centers and again of having that system already established throughout our state, and would ask that in future times that the communities...that the people in those communities would support those health centers and realize that they've come...they're already a long way down the road in looking and helping people when it comes to pregnancy testing and information, birth control methods, counseling, appropriate referral, and where those medical services are happening in those centers. They are provided by physicians, nurse practitioners and physicians assistants who I'm sure have had an abundance of training to be able to distribute that kind of information. So some of what we want is already out there. We just need to support it, I believe, and see that the information is there. And if you have one of those health centers in your community, I would suggest you visit it and see what kind of community support you could give for them and that information could come out sometimes when, I'm in hopes, more and more before the fact instead of after the fact. At this point in time, I will support the Lindsay amendment and after we've spent some time on the bill we'll see what happens on Final Reading.
