SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Chambers, on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, there is a substitute amendment up there. And Senator Baack and I looked at the figures that he has here. And that amendment would still reduce the 15 to 14, but it would allow the daily to go from \$2 to \$2.50. That is what would be before us. SENATOR HALL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: I apologize. Just for a point of clarification. We're now discussing the substitute amendment, is that correct?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it would raise the \$2 daily fee to 2.50 instead of leaving it at 2. That's the difference in the amendment.
