

Commission power to raise at their discretion a host of fees. And then he wants to say, let there be bicycle trails. You know who's going to be riding bicycles and got enough time to go out there and do all that? People like him, who've got leisure time and got money. And they can't understand anybody who's not in the same situation they're in. And they probably can't stand those people either. And I'm tired of hearing that kind of stuff. But they'll keep talking it and I'm going expressing how I feel about it. I hope his bicycle trail bill has passed 'cause I see a different attitude in Senator Beutler than the one I thought he had. I misread him. These parks should be available to as many people as possible. And I have no sympathy for or connection with the people who go to Mahoney Park and stay in those cabins. You're not going to see me fellowshiping with Harold Anderson and his ilk. They'll be able to take care of themselves. And they've got plenty of people on the floor who'll do that for them. But how many on the floor think about the others who are not situated as they are? I think about them. And I care about them. And this body is too quick and flip to raise fees and say it's easy for everybody to pay them 'cause it's easy for me to pay them. But you know what I read in the paper? They say this is a farming state. And I see where there are going to be cuts in the amounts of subsidies to the smaller size farms. And the bigger sized farms are going to continue to get the lion's share. And I don't hear people like Senator Hillman, Senator Beutler, and Senator Witek say, oh well those little people, they shouldn't be in farming if they need bigger subsidies. It doesn't mean much. And as a person who lives in the city it doesn't hurt me at all. But it's different strokes for different folks. I don't believe that the people on this floor realize how insensitive a lot of the things are that they say, how totally unfeeling. But that's what happens when you live in a homogeneous environment and everybody's like you. Everybody talks like you, everybody walks like you, everybody dresses like you, everybody goes to the same church, they sing the same songs, they do everything the same, and then they begin to think that what they are is what the whole world is and anybody like, not like them is somehow inadequate. They wouldn't be poor if they weren't wrong. We should just pass a bill outlawing poor people, then you can raise the fees as high as you want to. But the fees that are raised are not the fees that we put on the things that the welfare people enjoy. We don't even want to tax their corporate jets 'cause that's too heavy a burden on them. But the parks, that ought to be open to everybody. The cost of getting into those parks will be raised,
